Curriculum - Design and Recommendations

- Design
 - We designed our curriculum in collaboration with experts from UC and CSU
 - Worked with Dr Hatem Bazian, Lecturer in Arabic, Department of Near Eastern Studies, UC Berkley
 - Worked with Sumaya Berzrati, Professor of Arabic, Modern and Classical Languages and Literatures Department, CSU Northridge
- Recommendations
 - Received letters of recommendation from UC and CSU
- We use famous textbooks "Al-Asas" textbook series
- Use supplemental materials and worksheets designed by the instructors.

Courses Offered

- Arabic 1
 - This course aims at giving the students an introduction to the speaking, reading and writing of Elementary Arabic language.
- Arabic 2
 - This course aims at giving the students intermediate understanding to the speaking, reading and writing conventions of Intermediate Arabic language.
- Arabic 3
 - This course aims at giving the students advanced understanding to the speaking, reading and writing conventions of Advanced Arabic language.

Teaching Staff

 - She has California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET) for Arabic 1, 2 and 3.
 - She also has 8+ years of teaching high school in addition to experience teaching at elementary and middle school levels.
 - She also has experience creating A-G syllabus for the past 9 years of her experience. Her A-G Arabic syllabus was accepted when Averroes high school applied to be an Accredited school.

When To Register

- This is meant for Jr High and High School Students
- Caveat if registering when student is in Grade 7
 - Must complete all 3 levels so Arabic 3 shows on Grade 9 transcript
 - If you drop after Arabic 2, then you will not see any credit in high school transcript and would not satisfy the requirement

High School and UC Requirements

- High school graduation requires 2 years for foreign language
- The UC and CSU school student require 2 years of foreign language in high school, and 3 years are recommended.
- We strongly recommend to complete 3 years

Class Location and Schedule

- We host all of our classes in-person at ILM Academy
- Twice per week sessions
 - Tuesdays: 5:30 pm-7:00 pm
 - Saturdays: 11:00 am-1:00 pm
- In addition to a main instructor, we will also be having one or more T.A's as needed in the classroom
- Extended office hours outside class times to make sure students are able to get their questions answered in a timely manner

FAQ

- Course Load
 - The course load and requirements are comparable to other language courses by your local school district.
 - Students will receive 5 credits per semester for taking Arabic. So 10 foreign language credits per year.
- Student Teacher Ratio
 - To maintain a high standard of learning and the best classroom experience, we will be keeping a very small student teacher ratio. We cap registration so that the instructors:students ratio is 1:20
